WHEREAS: Neuromyelitis optica is a rare autoimmune disease often misdiagnosed as

multiple sclerosis; and

WHEREAS: Neuromyelitis optica affects vision and mobility, and currently there is no

cure: and

WHEREAS: When mistaken and/or treated for other autoimmune disorders,

neuromyelitis optica attacks occur more often and can be aggressive; and

WHEREAS: Neuromyelitis optica occurs when the body's immune system attacks its

own cells, primarily the optic nerves and spinal cord causing vision disturbances, blindness, neuropathy pain, mobility deficits, and/or

paralysis; and

WHEREAS: Awareness of this disease can help provide more research and better

treatments; and

WHEREAS: The neuromyelitis optica community is dedicated to increasing awareness

and understanding of this disease in order to promote research, improve

patient care and outcomes, and find a cure;
